Nick is currently the Artistic Director of the Lehigh Valley Chorale in eastern Pennsylvania, the Director of the Youth Pride Chorus of NYC, and an Instructor in Music at the New York Film Academy.



#### About the Piece

I often struggle with the idea that significant tragedies in life "happen for a reason." Psychology tells us that this can be a useful way to reframe events in order for us to cope with them - a way to find meaning in the senseless. However, this reframing can often diminish our collective sense of accountability. We must ask ourselves: "What can I do? What action can I take?"

In this piece, I ask the question: "Where do we find hope?" Hope can be found in the mundane, in the little things, but when life becomes pitch black, where do we find the light?

This piece is a gentle call to action; an affirmation that hope is not simply discovered but **created** by us: in how we treat others; in the ways we show love to our friends and family; in offering help to a stranger. We have to start somewhere. I hope this piece inspires you to lead with curiosity rather than judgement, and serve as a musical reminder that you never know what someone is going through. Because, at the end of it all, don't we just want to be loved?
